

**Information Technology Professionals Association Inc
Minutes of the Annual General Meeting
held at Google,
Corroboree Tech Talk, Level 5, 48 Pirrama Road, Pyrmont
on Wednesday, 13 December 2017**

- WELCOME:** Robert Hudson welcomed everyone to the meeting.
- PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** Robert Hudson presented his President's Report.
Robert thanked our sponsors, IT Masters, Symantec, Zettagrid and CQR. Thanks was also given to Google, who are hosting the AGM.

ITPA – A Year in Review

ITPA formed in September 2016 out of the “ashes” of SAGE-AU.

- Focus on all IT Professionals, not just SysAdmins
- Change in membership model
 - New “associate” tier, zero cost
 - New “CPM” membership tier to recognise continued professional development
- Drive to grow recognition of the organisation in the market.
 - We are now in monthly contact with 17,000+ IT Professionals (from a historical aggregate total of 5,000 which is a significant improvement).

What have we done well?

- Direct contact with 15,000+ IT Professionals in Australia and abroad.
- Engagement with media – averaging one press release per month on topical subjects.
 - Media now starting to come to us to ask our opinion on topics!
- Engagement with other NFPs and organisations
 - Sponsored linux.conf.au in 2017, sponsoring again in 2018.
 - Founding member of the Beyond 2020 Alliance
- Introduction of “CPM” program to track continued professional development of our members.

What haven't we done so well?

- Membership engagement – we still struggle to find/attract volunteers (either on the board or to run specific projects/tasks).
- Members services are still not complete
 - Work is ongoing to fix and improve some services and to bring some services online (MFA) or automate the provision of the service (IPv6)
 - Some services shut down (Chapter Meetings/Meetups largely not occurring).
- Converted new associate members to financial members
 - 17,000+ associate members, financial membership numbers largely stagnant since we moved from SAGE-AU.

Other things that have happened

- Shut down of SAGE-AU as a legal entity is almost complete.
 - All financial assets of SAGE-AU have been transferred to ITPA, some intellectual assets outstanding.
- Defence of the SAGE-AU trademark. We still use the SAGE-AU trademark on some online services (the SAGE-AU member site, for instance, which is still used to provision some services, and many members still carry SAGE-AU keyrings or other items with the SAGE-AU mark. Significant time and a not-insignificant amount of money (~\$5K) has been spent on this.
 - We have offered to co-exist under certain terms. Deadline for response is 15th December.

What does the future hold?

- We are working hard to ensure all promised member services are fully available and delivery of them is optimised – reduces administrative overhead (and cost of service provision).
- Increase our profile and recognition across all fields of IT.
 - Aiming for a 30% increase in CY2018
- With a new board, new ideas on what services we can offer to make financial membership more compelling.
 - Drive for 15% increase in financial members in CY2018.

Motion to adopt the President's Report as presented was moved by Mike Ciavarella, seconded by John Krebs. Motion Carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Robert Hudson presented the Financial Report.

Robert thanked our sponsors, IT Masters, Symantec, Zettagrid and CQR. Robert also thanked the Sharon Philp, the ITPA back office support.

Detailed Financial Reports

- Mainly our sponsorship money is spent on marketing.

Financial Summary

- ITPA is currently financially stable – ITPA Board Members have signed a solvency statement to ASIC to this effect.
- Financial Sponsorship equates to 57% of all ITPA income

- This needs to be adjusted – a real focus on FY18 on increasing membership income.
- Other income streams are being investigated.

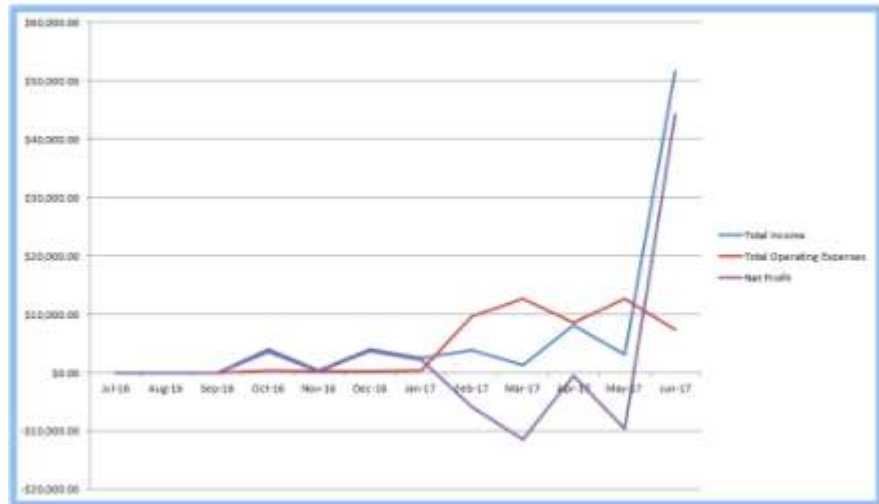
Financial Summary (~9 months)

- \$79,410 Net Income (57% sponsorship, 43% membership fees)
- \$49,585 Operating Expenses
- \$29,854 Net Surplus

Where do we spend our money?

- \$40,000pa on newsletters and press releases
- \$30,000pa on back office costs
- \$4,500 on hosting of services (Discourse/forums, AWS, MailGun, MailChimp)

Profit & Loss



The peak in operating expenses is attributed to the registration of the new trademark and closing down SAGE-AU.

Mike Ciavarella: Are there any tax implications to in-kind sponsorship?

Robert Hudson: No, as they are not issuing an invoice; it's a donation of services. Robert to confirm. We are wanting to register as a charitable organisation. A PDF will be published on the website.

Motion to move the Treasury Report as presented was moved by Mike Ciavarella, seconded by Philip Saunders. Motion Carried.

Mike Ciavarella presented his Secretary's Report.

- Day to Day office management/admin by Secretariat (Sharon Philp)

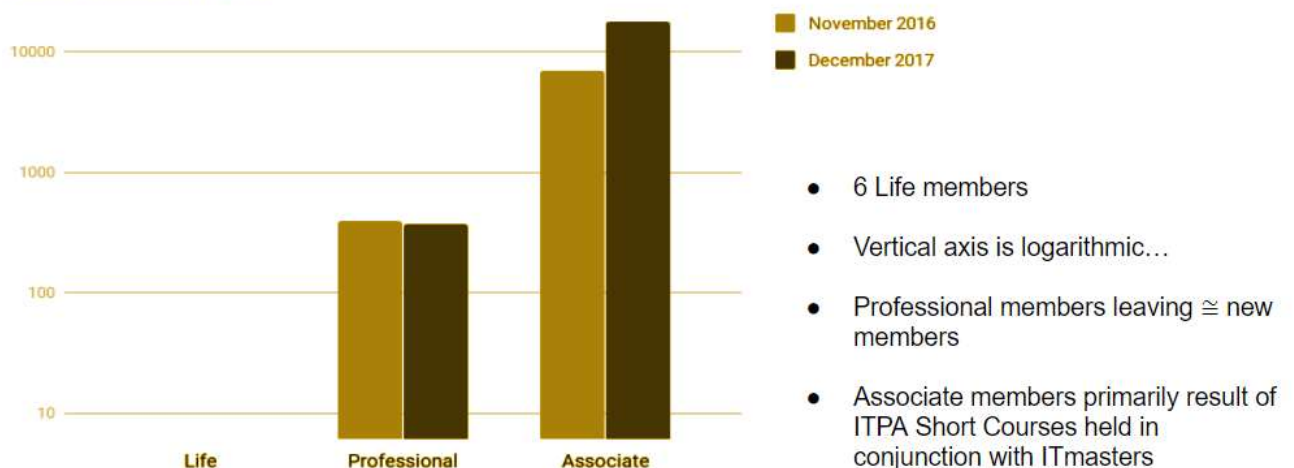
- Sharon previously worked with SAGE-AU

Administration: Systems

- ITPA systems managed by a team which includes Board members, volunteers and other service providers.

 - There is a learning curve for some systems (up-front investment)
 - There is a productivity/management curve; allow 1-2 hours a week minimum commitment. *We understand that the real-world exists and that availability can fluctuate. Being able to budget time is important.*
 - You will need to sign an NDA with ITPA
